Breath Prayer

We begin with awareness of breath.

Take a deep breath – in and out.

As you continue breathing, just notice the sensations of the breath moving in and out of your body.

In Hebrew, the word for breath, ruah, also means spirit, just as inspire means both to breathe in and to fill with spirit.

The Spirit moves in each of us like our breath.

The same molecules of air we breathe now have been breathed by every creature, every human being that has ever lived, including Jesus.

As we continue breathing, we call on the Spirit.
