Homily Reflection:

This lent, we are focusing on Embracing God's Abundance. The abundant Life comes from God, as opposed to the Good Life, required of Society. This week's focus is on time. How often have you said "I don't have time?" we are put n edge, and anger is not far behind. This is what happens in Society in our drive toward the Good Life – power, prestige and possessions.

Africans say "we create time." They don't have clocks yet somehow they converge at the same time. When has time stood sill for you. Time stood still for Moses at the bush that was on fire but didn't burn. Time stood still for the Jewish Community as Jesus was undercutting their religion's foundation. When Joseph was thrown into the Cistern by his jealous brothers, time stood still. Time stood still for Peter when the cock crowed and he realized his betrayal, and for Mary when she saw her sone on the Cross. When has time stood still for you? How did you handle COVID and time in the lockdown. In this season of tent, it is time to repent, which means re-think. Let us repent so that our time on earth is a time of peace and joy.
