

The Baptism of our Lord January 11, 2026

“You Are My Beloved”

Jesus’ Baptism was a touchstone moment in his life. From that moment on he knew that he was deeply loved by God, and that he was called to mission. My understanding of what happened at Jesus’ Baptism has been informed by Richard Rohr, O.F.M. in *Jesus’ Plan For A New World*. Two points have stuck with me as most significant throughout the decades since I first read them.

The first is how revolutionary was John’s baptizing. Let’s put this in context: for centuries, the Jewish priests have mediated between God and the people. As John baptizes in the Jordan, he proclaims that God is as available to us as water in the river, available to all who come for it. He is defying the religious institutions and leadership of his time. He’s saying they are not needed for people to reach God and to receive God’s forgiveness. Jesus affirms this in requesting baptism by John, as he seeks his own direct and right relationship with God.

The second is how deeply affecting is God’s immediate, direct and affirming response. The skies open and the dove of God’s Presence descends near and a voice proclaims, “This is my beloved Son.” From this moment on Jesus knew who he was and what he was called to do. To the very depths of his being Jesus heard God speak, “You are my beloved” and to the depths of his being he

took that in, embraced it, accepted it, and lived by it. That’s what gave him the courage to proceed in the ministry of his revolutionary Gospel, proclaiming – as did his cousin John – that God’s healing Love is available to everyone: the marginalized, the poor, and those ostracized by religious institutions.

I wonder how much we could learn from Jesus’ awareness that he was God’s beloved, for we too are God’s beloved. Our spiritual life is not about perfection, or how much we do, or how much we accomplish, but fundamentally is living in the knowledge that we are loved by God and then allowing God’s loving grace to flow through us.




Fair Trade Coffee: We are ordering Fair Trade coffee for Sunday mornings.
