Pastoral Reflection Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 21, 2024

"'Come after me...' Then they abandoned their nets and followed him."

With our readings today, we have an element of prophetic voice, and a corresponding opportunity to respond to that calling. The technological advances of the last few decades have allowed the amplification of voices, but with all that noise what can actually be heard?

How would we have responded to Jonah, this strange man walking through the streets predicting our demise unless we transform our lives? Personally, I think I probably would have avoided eye contact, maybe looked at my phone, picked up my pace a bit until I was safely past and able to "go on with my life." And that is part of the struggle, the incredible pull of inertia makes every change—necessary for transformation—an exhaustive effort. This necessitates a conscious effort on our part to quiet ourselves, to take a breath, and to truly listen.

What would we do if a stranger came up to us while at work and told us to leave everything and everyone we've known and to follow him? Again, it is hard for me to imagine what it would take to put down my net and follow. I do not let go or say goodbye easily. This is where St. Ignatius' teaching on "detachment" comes into play. Sometimes we think of temptation as that which is "evil" or "wrong," but Ignatius described detachment as the "making use of those things that help to bring us closer to God, and leaving aside those things that don't."

Loving God, grant us the peace to listen to the prophetic voices in our lives, the strength to set aside that which drowns You out, and the grace to see You in all things.






