- Ready for Winter will implement a grant program to help our families with weatherization to keep them warmer and their utility expenses lower. Handy volunteers will be needed. We will be collecting warm, gently used coats, hats and blankets or throws. AND asking high school volunteers to sort and organize, but they will need a "mature" but kindly overseer. Is that you?
- Ongoing efforts to help with passports, immigration check-in accompaniments, and Power of Attorney workshops need volunteers, particularly attorneys, notaries public and Spanish speakers.
- Abide in Love St. Genevieve has been finding ways to minister to the needs of the incarcerated. We will be firming up ideas for how we can participate in their efforts, perhaps as pen pals, and getting that info out to you soon.
- The International Institute has a Community Thanksgiving scheduled for November 23, 4 to 6pm, at their Grand location.

• The Logistics Support Team is an effort to connect non-Spanish speakers with tasks that will be helpful for our immigrant friends who are facing increasing challenges as detentions ramp up.

## What's been going on...

Over the past few weeks, our support as members of the Immigrant and Refugee Ministry has helped fund and organize:
