Reflection November 3, 2024 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hear, O Israel<u>! The Lord our God is Lord</u> alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

Jesus replies to the scribe's question, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" with the **Shema**, the passage from Deuteronomy in our first reading. Jesus adds the second

commandment about loving your neighbor.

The **Shema Yisrael** is the Jewish sacred profession of faith, prayed several times a day, individually and communally. It expresses belief in the singularity of God, that is, in God's oneness and incomparability. Jewish martyrs have often prayed the Shema as their final profession of faith. For Jesus this was an integral part of his spirituality. The prayer focused on the deep love between God and the Jewish people: "I will be your God, and you will be my people." (Jer: 33). Jesus drew on that love tradition when he preached during his lifetime. Early Christians continued that tradition in their preaching. We continue it today.

At this time we need to hold fast to that tradition and live it each day. Who is my neighbor? Jesus answered that question too. In our highly polarized country and world, this can be highly challenging on a day-by-day basis. Listening and being respectful will be needed even more after Nov. 5. We will also need a strong witness to counter those claiming hate, unbridled power, and violence are the core of the Christian message.

We are called to work together with other religious traditions who profess a God who loves humanity, who loves all creation, for unity and communion in our country and world. We are called to stand with and support those facing hostility, bigotry, fear and injustice. We, the community at St. Cronan's, will continue to respond wholeheartedly to those who need our companionship in this difficult time. Each will do what she or he can, and we will respond also as a community of love.

What we may need to do now is set aside some time in our lives filled with many commitments and concerns. We will need to squeeze out time each day to be still, to listen to God's voice addressing each of us and all of us. We will need to be clear in our focus and our belief.


