Pastoral Reflection

31st Sunday in Ordinary Time November 5, 2023

Being human is hard. Living is hard. Life, by its very nature, comes with its share of burdens, pain, suffering, despair. There is no avoiding it. It is simply part and parcel of what it means to be human.

The gift of today's readings, alluded to in all three of them, is that they all—Malachi, Paul, Matthew—apparently recognize just how hard life is ... and they take clear aim at those in power who would add to the weight that all of us must carry.

The first reading has Malachi taking direct aim at the temple priests, cursing them for failing "to listen," for causing "many to falter by [their] instruction," and for showing "partiality in their decisions."

Matthew builds on the critique of Malachi, pointedly having Jesus instruct his disciples to not follow the example of the scribes and the Pharisees because they "preach but they do not practice" and they "tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them." Too many leaders within our own Church do everything they can to add to the burdens of what it is to be human in our world today. Whether by the weight of their judgment or the wielding of Church teaching like a hammer, too many of our Church leaders deny the Jesus who proclaimed, "Come to me, all you who labor

and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." (Matt 11:28-30)

Too often the face that our Church leadership shows to the world seems to evidence little respect for nor understanding of the labors and burdens that accompany human life, passing over mercy, gentleness, compassion, and empathy in favor of inflexibility, condemnation, an insistence on the following of their rules, and their own hardening of hearts.


Paul lays it out as it should be in the second reading from the first letter to the Thessalonians.

"We were gentle among you, as a nursing mother cares for her children.

With such affection for you, we were determined to share with you not only the gospel of God, but our very selves as well, so dearly beloved had you become to us. ...

Working night and day in order not to burden any of you..."
May we long for such leadership within our Church and lift up those who practice such compassion, such "feeling with us,"—walking alongside us and sharing our burdens, not adding to them.


