The figure for the Third Sunday of

Advent, no matter whose Gospel we have, is John the Baptist, who was many things, put patient was not one of them. When he urged his fellow citizens to repent and prepare the road for the one who would come, he didn't mean tomorrow or whenever they got around to it. Every fiber of his being was oriented toward NOW. It is no wonder that his first recorded encounter with Jesus

led John to expect great things to happen all at once. Stand back and prepare to be amazed!

And then nothing happened. Nothing, that is, of what John was anticipating. Instead, time dragged on, John's situation got dicier, and eventually he was in Herod's jail facing death in short order. When was Jesus going to act? What had restrained him? What did John spend all that effort preparing the people for? The crowds, the tax collectors, and the soldiers had all asked John the same questions, "Who are you? "What would you have us do?" And now here were those questions again.

The answer is never vague or spiritualized. Neither John nor Jesus ever said, "Offer more ritual sacrifices; pray more prayers." The message is always the same. Share with those who need, forgive one another, stop taking advantage of the powerless, don't look for more than we need. Gospel action is concrete, material, and costs us something we can feel

> tangibly to straighten the road. The difference comes one person at a time as we all get the message one person at a time and open our hearts. Now, over two thousand years later, Jesus is still changing hearts one person at a time.




There will be no donuts after Mass on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.


