Growing up, I thought of the Holy Family of Mary, Jesus, and Joseph as some perfect nuclear family that serves as a standard for families. This was in part due to illustrations of the nativity scene that tend towards showing a peaceful scene with

Jesus was literally born inside a barn, in a trough meant for animals. There's no way there were sanitary conditions in there. Can you imagine Mary responding to her friends and

other family asking about how the birth went? How tempting it would have been to judge her for being an unfit parent!

Joseph was an adoptive father, and that alone make the Holy Family a "nontraditional"family. It is interesting that the Gospels attempt to reveal Joseph as a direct descendent of Abraham and David and at the same time show that he is not the biological parent of Jesus. On

top of that, Joseph was far from power or prestige—he was a small town tradesman.

Jesus' parents were probably not a very isolated nuclear family, the way our society expects that of parents. The Gospel of Matthew says Mary spent three months with her cousin Elizabeth. Three months! This suggests that families shared in the


load of taking care of each other and being present during challenging times (like carrying a growing child within you and all that can come with it).

Imagining the possibilities of what this Holy Family lived has helped me accept a standard, or ideal, that is less about perfection and more about listening to God, accepting the reality of life being mysterious and messy, and sharing

in that messiness with others in a spirit of compassion.

This Christmastide, may we seek to grow, alongside our family members (whether nuclear, extended, or others dear to us in our lives) closer to God.
