December 7, 2025

"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!"

Here we are, fully in the midst of the season of Advent, brought again to the banks of the Jordan River to answer anew this urgent question: are we truly prepared to be transformed, to receive the kingdom of heaven?

The Baptizer is speaking of heaven differently here than we often think of it, not as a reward given to individuals who have lived a life of God; instead the “kingdom of heaven” extends beyond the edge of one’s own heart and into the large-scale social and communal space.

It is right that such a call to turn our lives around and be transformed should happen in the midst of baptism—of being born again to new life. Baptism is both a deeply personal and a public act. We as a community are called, through our witnessing and the renewal of our baptismal vows, to be transformed anew and to hold each of our neighbors in loving and attentive care—to create the holding space for transformation in one another to occur.

It is also important to remember that John’s baptisms were occurring outside the traditional bounds of the religious establishment, and without the oversight and approval of official church leadership. In this setting, did Jesus Himself wade into

the water and emerge anew, ready to begin His ministry.

Transformation does not often come on the easy, paved, and state-sanctioned path; nor can transformation occur without the acceptance of risk and the insistence on truth-telling. “You brood of vipers!” John exclaims to the religious leaders coming to witness his transforming work. No matter our status, our privilege, we are implicated in the social wrongs at work, and we are required to participate in its transformation.

No hands but ours.

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


