Pastoral Reflection

First Sunday of Lent February 18, 2024

We are about to enter upon the "Season of Lent" when the church begins its annual retreat. There are those who were with us last year at this time, who have now gone to their eternal reward. We are here, once again, to make this journey though Lent as we begin Ash Wednesday on February 26, with the reception of ashes that we receive with the words, "Remember, you are dust, and to dust, you shall return."

In Old Testament times, ashes were used in a variety of religious ways. For example, in the book of Samuel (13:19), a woman puts ashes on her forehead as a sign of grief; in Jeremiah (6:26), people rolled in ashes as a sign of their repentance; in the book of Job (42:6), it was the custom of sprinkling ashes on oneself as a sign of repentance; and Jesus refers to the latter practice in the New Testament by saying, "If miracles were performed in you that you have performed in Tyre and Sidon, people would have put on sackcloth and sprinkled ashes on themselves to show their turning away from sin.'

As our foreheads are marked with ashes they become our sign of repentance. Repent means "to re-think." So

Lent is a time for us "to re-think" what is going on in our lives. Are we headed in a direction of peace and purpose? It's our time "to re-groove" ourselves. Don't let Lent just fly by, dig in and get life right.

To assist in "repenting" we invite you to pray the stations, attend Mass during the week, receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, abstain from meat on Fridays (and Ash Wednesday & Good Friday), fast a few days (especially Ash Wednesday & Good Friday), visit the homebound, have special family Lenten meals, pray with the family, plan to attend the Holy Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, & the Easter Vigil), etc. Yes, it's time to repent i.e. "re-think" what's happening in and around us. May we walk with Christ this Lenten Season.


