Pastoral Reflection

Fourth Sunday of Lent March 10, 2024

Several words come to the surface from the readings of this 4th Sunday in Lent: compassion, anger, mercy, grace, gift, great love, truth and light. In a recent encounter with one of my son's former classmates, I was describing his family as having "a couple of children." My friends who were with me immediately jumped in and said, "five is not a couple, that's several." We had a good laugh. That's how these readings strike me; there are several directions to explore. It's also a reminder to me of the constant wealth of the Scriptures, always rich, always new.

Both the wrath and the mercy of God is reflected in the story of the Hebrew people ending up enslaved in Babylon. It took the mercy of a new king to allow them to return to their homeland. Of course, everything was destroyed and they had to start over. Where is that continuing to happen in today's world? Can I find compassion and mercy toward those who are suffering so much even in this 21st century?

John tells us that God loved us so much that he sent his son. Paul expands on this thought by not only acknowledging God's great love but also the richness of God's mercy. Can I grab hold of these thoughts and be enveloped in this amazing love and mercy? The more I can receive it, the more it can be light to others through me.

How do I get there? One of the four focuses of our Lenten practices is prayer. In a refection on prayer Fr. James Martin quotes Karl Rahner in his book,"The Need of the Blessings of Prayer."

He uses Jesus's prayer in the Garden of Gethsemane (Lk 22:42) to suggest three important aspects of prayer. The first is honesty (get me out of this situation; I don't like it). The second is trust (I know you are always there for me, eg. you've got my back). And thirdly acceptance (if the situation isn't changing, I have to say yes, your way, not mine. See the Our Father, "your will be done on earth as it is in heaven"). My renewed Lenten resolution is to sit with this aspect of prayer. Maybe the Light will be brighter at Easter.


