Pastoral Reflection Palm Sunday March 24, 2024

This Sunday, Palm Sunday we will again hear of the of the corrupt trial and execution of Jesus. Unfortunately it is an all to familiar story here in the United States and in the "Pro-Life" State of Missouri. The execution of Brian Dorsey is scheduled for April 9th. The person that I testified on behalf of a year ago to help him escape the "needle" was in the same cell as Brian. He is devastated by Brian's impending fate. A couple of weeks ago Mr. Dorsey was removed from his cell and taken to a "death cell" (probably taken from Potosi Correctional Facility to Bonne Terre, the site for executions). The person that I know who was in the same cell as Brian is depressed and feeling guilty because he holds Brian in such high regard. He believes that Brian is totally rehabilitated and has done so much good in the prison.

Brian did not receive a single violation in 17 years and that is unheard of because the ridiculous nature of some of the "violations". He has the unprecedented support of 70 correctional officers. At other times CO's were reprimanded for reaching out on behalf of a death row inmate. The former Warden Troy Steele supports his clemency. A former Supreme Court Justice said: "this is a rare case where the Court got it wrong". Several jurors who voted for the death penalty are now asking that his sentence be commuted to life without parole because of the inadequate defense that he received. For 12 years Brian was the trusted barber who cut hair and beards for inmates.

correctional officers and even the Warden! Family and friends having written many letters including support from family members of the victims. What gives with our "death" State!

Two people were murdered and that is tragic and nothing can compensate for that loss nor the grief that those killings has caused. But the defense were contracted lawyers hired by the State because of the lack of funds for State death penalty defenders. Contracted lawyers at that time would have received \$3.37 an hour if they had put in the required time (which they did not). They merely pleaded Mr. Dorsey guilty in exchange for no benefit even though he had a defense (he was in a drug induced psychosis at the time of the murders.

They did it to Jesus. Let's not let them do this to Brian. Please help to stop the horror of this execution. All executions are egregious killing, but in Brian Dorsey's case this is utterly MAD!

Please send a letter, call or e-mail to plead with Governor to offer clemency.
