

## Pastoral Reflection

### Third Sunday of Easter

April 14, 2024

Shalom. Peace. The blessing and promise of Easter. How those words ring out for us this season! For me all the exuberance and hope explodes in joy when at the Easter Vigil we sing “All shall be well! For on our Easter skies see Christ the sun of righteousness arise...Jesus alive! Rejoice and sing again, ‘all shall be well forevermore, Amen!’”

Luke in today’s Gospel describes the women and men gathered together still reeling from the crucifixion and death of Jesus. They are distraught, even as they listen to the disciples from Emmaus relate how they met a stranger on the way and recognized Jesus in “the breaking of the bread.” The disciples had invited the Stranger to stay with them. Hospitality is central to Luke’s Gospel. As those gathered in the room hear this story, Jesus appears to all of them. “Peace be with you.” They are startled and terrified – as one might expect. He reassures them. It is truly Jesus. Then he invites their hospitality by asking them to give him something to eat. He recounts the Scriptures as he did for the disciples on the way to Emmaus. He sends them forth to preach the Gospel to all nations beginning from Jerusalem, the city of peace.

Luke clearly intends this message not only for those specific disciples, but also for the early Christian communities and through the ages to us as well. We at St. Cronan church recognize this command as our own. We continue to find ways in our personal lives and as a community to respond to Luke’s challenge

to set out on the journey, to see with eyes of faith, and to provide hospitality especially to the stranger and the marginalized. Like the disciples we often feel frightened and overwhelmed by the disorders in our world. To name a few: Israel/Gaza, Ukraine, the death penalty (i.e., Brian Dorsey), the proliferation of guns and other forms of violence, the nuclear weapons threat, racism, the lawmakers’ plans to control women, the political and divisive atmosphere in our country and in other parts of the world, and the refusal to acknowledge and address climate change. You can add many more. This is the place and time where we are called to preach the Gospel of love, forgiveness, and peace.

When I feel overwhelmed by the world in which we live, I seek community where I/we can find hope and hospitality and faith. I also go to You Tube because I need to remember Easter all year long. I play versions of “All Shall Be Well” to enter again a time of shalom and joy. The versions I hear are ok, but no comparison to our choir at the Easter Vigil and the Sundays of Easter time!

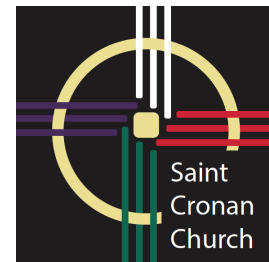
