Easter Sunday April 20, 2025

Easter invites us into a decision: will we walk the skeptical path, hardened by disappointment, or the trusting path of those who dare to believe in the triumph of the tender mercy of God? Belief is not naïve-té—it is patience, courage, and openness to joy even in a world of wounds. It encourages and gives hope that the St. Cronan community has accompanied five elect to join the Church, thus choosing this belief and joy within a world such as ours.

Historian René Girard speaks of the innocent victim—of how societies scapegoat the weak to preserve their own illusions of peace. But the Resurrection unravels that lie. In Jesus Christ, the scapegoat returns not with vengeance, but with peace. His wounds still visible, he speaks not blame but blessing: "Peace be with you."

This is no denial of suffering. As teacher Gerald Darring wrote, ours is an Easter religion in full view of the cross. We see wretched conflicts, poverty, division—and as Christians we are asked to confront and help in these circumstances—but we do not bow to them, nor put all our energies into grieving and fighting. We see through the cross, and beyond it. Christ's rising means that suffering will be vindicated,

death overcome, and love will have the last word.

Therefore, we are right and just to take time for celebration. Time must be taken for joyful singing and dancing. And for affirming the ways each of us children of God reflect the living Christ in our world today.

In every act of compassion, every moment we trust mercy over calculation and doubt, we live the Easter promise, and most especially when we do so with our neighbors, our family, and our communities. We rehearse the voice of God we will one day hear in full: "Come away, beloved. The winter is past; the flowers return to the earth."


