Pastoral Reflection Fifth Sunday of Easter *April 28, 2024*

I always get nervous when I prune things. It seems counterintuitive that in order for something to grow or bear fruit, that it must be trimmed back, cut, taken apart – that for something to live more fruitfully, a part of it must die. And yet, this is the cycle that is most constant in our lives. We yield to be taken apart so that we may be put back together, with anticipation of growth and newness and fruitfulness.

A friend who has children younger than mine (two of mine are legal adults now!) recently asked me with much hopefulness if, since my kids are older, I no longer have to follow behind and pick up after them. I, of course, laughed loudly and told of rooms that are oozing out into hallways with shoes and clothes and that the messes have only gotten bigger and more pervasive with teenagers as in addition to the house, the boys now fill up cars with their messes as well. Our discussion led into the importance of teaching, and modeling, good habits as parents. Although, like pruning, it can be painful to wait and hope to see fruits of this labor – this teaching and waiting for habits to take hold is a necessary pathway toward growth and independence.

This conversation had me pondering about my own habits and what I do and don't do in order to follow the Gospel message of today: "remain in me." God promises to remain in me, to remain in all of us. How are we fulfilling our command to remain in God? What habits are we committing to that allow us to be pruned and bear more fruit? During the season of Lent, I made a commitment to not turn to my phone during idle time and to spend that time instead in prayer, meditation or contemplation. I thought it would be a good habit to begin. I realized by the end of Lent that I need more pruning! Just as new habits are hard to start, old habits are hard to break. Lent gave me the opportunity to contemplate and to try and to fail, and to begin again.

What are some habits that might be leading you away from remaining in God, habits that you'd like to reconsider? What are some things you could intentionally do on a daily or weekly basis that could become habitual, that could lead you toward remaining in God? We have the opportunity to do some of our own self-pruning, to choose to remain in God and bear the fruit that comes from adopting growth-producing habits...to clean up our own messes.


