I invite you to pray the Stations of the Resurrection. —Fr. Jack

1.) Jesus Rises From the Dead

Pray for the Grace to truly believe.

2.) The Disciples Discover the Empty Tomb

What joy, wonder and fear must the earliest disciples have felt upon discovering the empty tomb?

3.) The Risen Lord Appears to Mary Magdalene, Apostle to the Apostles

Like Mary, do we cling to the Lord?

4.) The Risen Lord Appears on the Road to Emmaus

Are we able to recognize Christ when he appears in our life and we are not expecting him?

5.) The Risen Lord is recognized in the Breaking of the Bread.

Pray for the grace to truly experience the deep mystery of Christ's Real Presence in the Eucharist.

6.) The Risen Lord Appears to the Community of Disciples

When we gather with two or more people, do we acknowledge Christ's presence?

7.) The Risen Lord Breathes Peace and Gives the Power to Forgive

Who in my life do I need to forgive more fully?

8.) The Risen Lord Strengthens the Faith of Thomas

Pray for a deeper, more unquestioning faith.

9.) The Risen Lord Eats With the Disciples on the Shore of the Tiberias

When we eat, do we stop to give thanks to God for the great gift of nourishment?

10.) The Risen Lord Forgives Peter and Entrusts Him to Tend and Feed His sheep

Say a short prayer for the leaders in the church and leaders everywhere.

11.) The Risen Lord Sends the Disciples Into the World

Share the Good News of Christ through giving time to someone.

12.) The Risen Lord Ascends Into Heaven

Take a moment at bedtime and pray for all of your relatives and friends who are with the saints in heaven.

13.) Mary and the Disciples Keep Vigil in the Upper Room for the Spirit's Advent

Ask Mary to share her deep, abiding faith with all of us who dwell waiting for the Second Coming.

14.) The Risen Lord Sends the Holy Spirit

Thank God for the gift of the Holy Spirit to give us wisdom and guide our lives.
