Pastoral Reflection Seventh Sunday of Easter *May 12 , 2024*

"I want to tell you all a secret—a dangerous and radical secret: Jesus never actually ascended into Heaven. He exploded!"

So began my liberation theology class during my semester abroad in San Salvador, and I have never looked at the Feast of the Ascension the same way.

Other than the sheer subversive shock value of such a sentiment, this interpretation of the Ascension communicates a vital theological message: God is with us. Here, now. Wherever we go, there He shall be. Even on dirty trash-laden streets, even in a humble home, even in the face of the one we despise or think ourselves better than, there I AM.

In our Gospel today we are called to proclaim the Good News to every creature, and what "Good-er" news could there be than this?

This may seem to be an obvious truth for us now, but we must remember that the field of "liberation theology" at its onset was considered quite radical, communistic, even heretical by some. The temptation was strong to communicate to the poor and the downtrodden—those pushed to the margins—to keep their eyes to the Heavens and worry not about the sufferings of the world. Jesus ascended, and we should look upwards toward the Heavens until one day we may join Him in Heaven, up there. But if instead of ascending, Jesus exploded? Well, then look no further than the face from which you avert your gaze, than the street by which you'd rather pass.

The miracle of the Ascension is not only that death loses its sting, but that distance does as well. That-Which-Makes-Us-One "exploded" so that our Oneness may echo throughout. And truly taking seriously the rippling ramifications of such a belief, where, I wonder, may that lead us?

If you are able to bring a dessert to share, please let us know. Please note: There will be no 8am mass May 19.




