Fifth Sunday of Easter May 18, 2025

"Do you have an image, a picture, and idea of God that especially speaks to you at this time? This was the question for reflection that we were given at a recent prayer gathering. Many responses were posted: friend, sister, energy, sustainer, steppingstone, river, challenger, one who cries with us, etc. But the one that intrigued our table was "the one who bows." We asked the woman who offered this image if she could tell us more about it.

She responded that often we image God in the distance on a throne with all of us paying homage. She has been thinking about how God bowed down, became human in Jesus, to show us the breadth and depth of God's love. All of us, all creation, was amazingly changed when God chose to become human, to take on matter, even to the extent of suffering and a horrible death.

We are called to bow to one another. In John's Gospel account, Jesus tells the disciples that we are to love as God loves. No limit, no holding back a portion for ourselves, no ranking of family, friends, then "others." This is the God in whose image and likeness we are made: "love one another."

Johnny's pastoral reflection from the 4th Sunday of Easter reminds us of the Gospel's demands, of persecution for our faith. There is no room for complacency or acceptance of systems or actions that are opposed to the love God shows us. The reading this Sunday from the Acts of the Apostles exhorts the disciples (we are those disciples today) to persevere in faith, to endure many hardships for the reign of God. Bowing in love, responding to whatever injustices we are called to address in order to express that love, is the way we image God. So that we don't forget this important truth, the reading from Revelations affirms that God dwells with the human race. We, all of us, are God's people.

This is a week we could reflect on God as the one who bows. We can seek ways to live in this image and likeness of our God. Whose world are we called to enter? To listen, to understand, to love as God loves?

In this fifth week of the Easter season, we continue to rejoice in the Risen Christ. We might deepen our hope by singing in our hearts with great exuberance this Easter song:

All shall be well! For on our Easter skies See Christ the Sun of Righteousness arise.

Jesus alive! Rejoice and sing again. All shall be well forever more. Amen.
