In the Gospel of John, we hear Jesus offering courage-provoking words to His disciples in anticipation of His coming departure from the earth in the form He currently inhabits.

"I am going away and I will come back to you."

He wants them to take heart and remember that He will remain with them as a companion in the form of the Paraclete, the Advocate, the Holy Spirit.

Very recently and unexpectedly, a longtime friend of mine in the L'Arche community died, leaving what feels like a pit of despair and sadness in my core. My heart is troubled. I am sad for the life my friend did not get to live. I feel compassion for others also experiencing suffering in response to this death. And I am afraid of what is lost.

Jesus's words offer consolation to me. I am helped to give myself permission to release the guilt and pressure I feel to react to this death in a particular way—whether that be to spend time doing certain things, or to say certain things to people. I need not be afraid.

I worry about the loss of this person's gifts and role in the community. But the God that dwelled in this friend will return in the way the Holy Spirit manifests Jesus after Jesus' death. I already see examples: When I spoke

out among other mourners, "this friend will not be around to cook with me as we had planned," someone spoke up to say they would be happy to cook with me. When it was pointed out, "she was in the middle of crafting a blanket for a friend that is an expecting mother," another volunteered quickly and boldly, "I will finish it."

This friend lives on, as Jesus lives on, in the presence of the Holy Spirit. And the Holy Spirit can be found in the very people around us. My friend and Jesus went away, yet they are also coming back, finding embodiment in new and real ways.


