Trinity Sunday June 15, 2025

Growing up, I remember various moments around the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity when my brothers and I would return home from Sunday school to excitedly present our "shamrock Trinity" drawing, or to share a new and fresh image of the Trinity we learned—like that of an apple, with skin and flesh and core. Dad would acknowledge our creation, mumble a few words of admiration, before he would inevitably succumb to explosive exasperation: "The Trinity is not a math problem, guys!"

All the images we try to utilize to illuminate the doctrine of the Trinity are ultimately concerned with a "numbers problem," and they therefore use static images for God. The same prevailing misunderstanding of the Trinity underlines each of these images: at their most basic they still scarcely rise above—as one theologian described it—that of "two men and a bird" residing in heaven.

My father was able to study briefly with Catherine LaCugna, whose seminal book "God For Us" transformed his—and by extension, my own—understanding of the Trinity. As the title implies, LaCugna writes that the Trinity names how God is *God for us*. While for us relationships are something we enter into and pull away from, God does not enter into relationship:

God *is* perfect relationship; God is not relational, but God *is* right relationship.

The teaching of the Trinity emphasizes the Triune God's eternal movement toward us, through God's redeeming love. God's very Being is *for us*. And yet, LaCugna also insisted that the Trinity names our own graced movement toward God. We too are *for God*. This divine and dynamic dance is the work of our lives, and we are simply called to raise our hands to the sky and dance along, whomever we are with, wherever we may be.
