

In the Gospel today, Jesus feeds the five

thousand with a mere five loaves and two fish. Although many translations present Jesus' instructions to his disciples as, "Give them some food yourselves," in the original Greek, it is closer to "You give them food yourselves." The "you" is quite emphasized.

task with humility and faith that God will provide, we will find ourselves surprised by the abundance that miraculously blossoms through us.

Here again, we have one of Jesus' miracles, and again, we find that his miracles involve active participation by those around him. It is God who ultimately performs the miracle, but we do not see Jesus alone feeding five thousand. Rather, it is his disciples who carry out the actual, physical act of feeding the hungry, and it is through them that this miracle is ultimately made manifest.

Today, we are still being asked to feed the hungry. We can still hear Jesus commanding us: "You give them food yourselves."
