Pastoral Reflection

Feast of the Holy Trinity

Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, and the readings each do their part to reflect the beauty of this day and the significance of the Trinitarian teaching on our faith and our lives. In Exodus we find some descriptors of God's relational nature, a God who is "merciful and gracious," "slow to anger," "rich in kindness and fidelity," culminating in a request that God "receive us as Your own." Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians delineates

to the Corinthians delineates for us in a cohesive way the three persons of the Trinity and our primary call to "greet one another with a holy kiss"—to enter into relationship with one another. Then, in today's well-known Gospel reading from John, we hear that *in this way* God loved the world: by giving us His only Son; it is through this self-giving

life.

As a child, the Trinity both intrigued and confused me. I remember my dad responding to my Trinitarian questions with comments on loving relationship, but at the time this felt too abstract and esoteric for me to fully embrace. It was a reference to an airplane—with wings, cockpit, and engine, each serving their own purpose in their own way but all making up the same single entity—that got me to grasp the whole three-inone paradox of the Trinity. Though helpful for me as a child, this airplane model did not quite get to the heart of why the

Trinity has come to matter so much to me.

It is fitting that it has taken becoming a father myself for me to begin to understand what my dad was talking about. At its core, the Trinity is about the *verb* of Love. As I enter into this new Father-Son relationship, I am captivated by this new center of gravity in my life. Suddenly, I am drawn in a more focused and direct way into the triune roles of Lover, Beloved, and Love itself, as Augustine describes it. It is as "the Beloved/Son"

that I learned from my father what it meant to experience this gift of God's Loving Spirit, and it is now in my role as "Lover/Father" that I can *do love* in this new relationship, and thereby better experience the Spirit of Love. May it long continue.


