Pastoral Reflection

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time *June 10, 2024*

The Gospel today is striking because, at first glance, it seems that Jesus is *denying* salvation and forgiveness to anyone who blasphemes the Holy Spirit. This does not align with what we all know of God's all-encompassing forgiveness and love.

But if we look a little closer, this Gospel tells a different story. The Catechism states that "blaspheming against the Holy Spirit" refers to "anyone who deliberately refuses to accept [God's]

mercy ... [and] rejects the forgiveness of [their] sins" (1864). It is not God's love and forgiveness that are limited, but our ability to receive them. But what could lead us to reject forgiveness, let alone *God's* forgiveness?

The answer is found in the first reading. God knows that Adam and Eve have eaten of the fruit when Adam *hides himself* from God, which shows that Adam now experiences shame. The "fruit" that was taken in, the knowledge of good and evil, meant that *humans* began to split things into categories of "good" and "evil." We feel deep shame when we learn to label

parts of ourselves as bad or evil, and we psychologically split these parts off from our sense of self because they are too painful to identify with—we try to hide them away, as Adam does in the garden, or we project them onto others.

To accept forgiveness, we must face these parts of ourselves we have labelled evil. Sometimes this is too painful be-

> cause we are too ashamed. But in rejecting these parts of ourselves, in labelling them as "evil" and disowning them, we reject God's neverending offer of forgiveness and love.



June is gun violence awareness month.

Gun violence devastates individuals, families, and communities in the United States and the St. Louis Archdiocese.

Wear Orange is a movement to honor victims and survivors of gun violence and to raise awareness of the impact of gun violence, which began in 2013 by friends of Hadiya Pendleton. Hadiya marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade. One week later, she was shot and killed on a playground in Chicago. Soon after this tragedy, Hadiya's friends commemorated her life by wearing orange, the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others.

As we hear in today's Gospel, "...if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand." So, instead, let us stand together in solidarity this weekend with many Americans who wear orange in tribute to more than 43,000 Americans killed with guns and 76,000 more shot and wounded each year.
