Pastoral Reflection 14th Sunday in Ordinary Time July 9, 2023

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus tells us that God has "hidden these things from the wise and the learned" and "revealed them to little ones." The "things" he refers to could be interpreted as trust in God and understanding of one's need for God. In my time in L'Arche, friends with pronounced abilities outside of their cognitive/mental capacity frequently have a natural ability to give their con-

cerns and worries to God so they can be present to God's love surrounding them, and then offer that love to others. I easily think of two individuals who have a genuine way of expressing gratitude to those who assist them in providing something as simple as a ten-minute drive to their job or activity--it is a focused statement, not one made while staring at a phone or thinking about the next thing.

Needing others is an obvious part of life, so needing God innately makes more sense. For me, my ability to work for wages, budget and pay for my basic needs, and get around in my car leads me to forget how dependent I am on God to: inspire the invention of, and building of, vehicles I use, to bring rain and sun that grow the foods and animals I eat, to allow people to do their jobs like maintaining roads, delivering produce, engineering water treatment and electric grids, passing and enforcing laws that promote safety, educating our children...The list is endless.

Luckily, spiritual growth and mastery is attainable to anyone, and not even especially by the wise and the learned, like the Pharisees of Jesus' time. To find ourselves first among those of God's kingdom, we aren't likely to be successful by the world's standards. Let us seek authen-

tic gratitude and humility regarding the ways we need God, like those I've gotten to know in L'Arche, by acknowledging the contributions of all who/ that labor for the care of creation, from the scientist experimenting on sustainable practic-

es, to the wrinkly great grandmother sitting telling stories to her grandkids, to the bees hovering around wildflowers, pollinating them.


