In this weeks Gospel we have the apostles facing the wind and the waves. So Jesus comes to calm their fears. That same Christ is present to calm our fears and right our ships. So many in our archdiocese seem to be facing the "winds and waves" of All Things New". This is not an easy time for our local church. Pray that unlike Peter they do not sink under the changes affecting the baptismal waters of the people of our Archdiocese.

I wanted to let you know that out of 178 parishes in the Archdiocese St. Cronan was the 6th highest when it it came to contributions for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD). That is outstanding - stand tall! We not only say we are interested in Social Justice but we also put our money where our mouth is. Again, 25% of this collection stays in St. Louis for small grants and the rest goes to the National Office. We have one group here in St. Louis this that will be receiving a national grant.

Also, congratulations on exceeding our Archdiocesan Catholic Appeal goal of \$20,502. Because of All Things New the ACA is is struggling a bit. This collection is so key for so many agencies in the Archdiocese. As a matter of fact the Immigration Collaborative that we are partnering with has received a \$40,000 grant. We met with the new Coordinator last Monday Kevin Kuehl. Trish Curtis is our representative on the Board. You will hear more about their activities as they begin their efforts. And, classroom donations for St. Cecilia and St. Louis Academy have been over the top. Carloads of important classroom items have been delivered already. Teachers and administrators (and soon the children) have been so grateful for our assistance. Too often in schools in struggling areas the teachers reach into their meager salaries to provide needed items for their students. We are their angels.

We are now sponsors for City Greens as folks here contributed over \$1,000 to assist them in their efforts to provide fresh produce in our 63110 food dessert.

Again St. Cronan has contributed to the wellbeing of our local community.

All I can say is "thank you, thank you". Your support for these community needs is so humbling to me as your Pastor (former Pastor!). Your generosity challenges me to be "get with the program" here at St. Cronan. You all stretch me to be more Gospel driven.


