Pastoral Reflection Exaltation of the Cross September 14, 2025

As a convert, I must admit that I've not always had an appreciation for John 3:16. When I encountered this verse in my life prior to becoming Catholic, it was primarily in awkward and ill-conceived evangelization attempts.

Even after becoming Catholic, the many instances in which I encountered this verse seemed to heavily imply an overly simplistic ransom narrative of salvation. The thought of our supposedly loving and omnipotent God needing to "buy" humanity back from the Devil in such a gruesome way left me ill at ease.

Over the years, my response to this verse has softened. On this Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, I'm able to approach this verse with a little more reverence, and in-so-doing to also hold the ransom theory of salvation a little more lightly.

Christ's ransom, as is true of most great religious concepts, is a rich metaphor—for indeed a great price was paid on the Cross. This metaphor functions alongside various other facets of Salvation to paint a fuller picture of the human condition in relation to Christ.

As theologian Jeremy Wilkins once wrote me, "Our redemption is had only on a condition, or conditions, which begin with the Cross Christ freely accepted out of love for us, and includes the crosses we freely accept out of love for Him. So we can think of the Cross—His and ours—as an expression of sorrow for sin, but that's not all. We can think of it as a sacrifice of obedience to God's mysterious will, but that's not all."

Each understanding of the mystery of salvation that we find at the foot of the Cross is part of, but not *all* of, God's gratuitous love for us. But today's Gospel reminds us of the heart of each of these unfurling understandings—for God so loved the world.
