Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ."

Then Jesus warned the disciples not to tell anyone about him.

He began to teach them that the Anointed One must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days.

He spoke this openly.

Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do."

He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "If you wish to come after me you

must deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow me. For if you save your life will you will lose it, but if you lose your life for my sake and that of the gospel you will save it."
